Two Kinds of Computer Files

- Computer files come in two flavors, *text* files and *binary* files
- *Text* files provide a standard character set and are readable by essentially every computer system
- Any file that is not a text file is a *binary* file; binary files are specific to particular computer systems and programs

Text Editors

- Are computer programs for creating and editing text files
- Nearly every computer system comes with some kind of text editor, e.g., DOS comes with **edit**, Windows 95 with **notepad**
- More powerful text editors are often useful, however, and it is worth being acquainted with them

Text Editor Features

- Spell-checking
- Search and replace
- Case changes
- Macros
- Pattern searching
